## MANAGER'S CORNER:

There's another big trash container over by the compactor. Now is the time to get rid of those unwanted items. Please take advantage of this time to clean up around your property. **PLEASE DO NOT DUMP TIRES, BATTERIES, APPLIANCE, PAINT OR OTHER TOXICS.**

Reminder if your mobile home insurance has expired in the last couple months and have not brought an update copy to the office, please do so. I will be sending out letters to those that have expired or have not given me a copied of the mobile insurance. This is a requirement of the park.

Parking: You are allowed 2 vehicles per home site. If you have more than 2 vehicles, you must remove one for the park or rent and extra space by RV parking. The **NO PARKING ON STREETS** is being enforced. Vehicles will be towed at the owner's expense. There are many reasons for this rule.

1. Mail delivery 2. Home transportation 3. Emergency Vehicles (this is a safety issue to ensue that all emergency vehicles have an open and clear street to reach their destination when needed).

We will be resuming the replacing the water meters on all the homes in the community. Some have already been changed. We will notify in advance when your street is being done. Unfortunately, they are not electronically read, so reading will still be door to door.

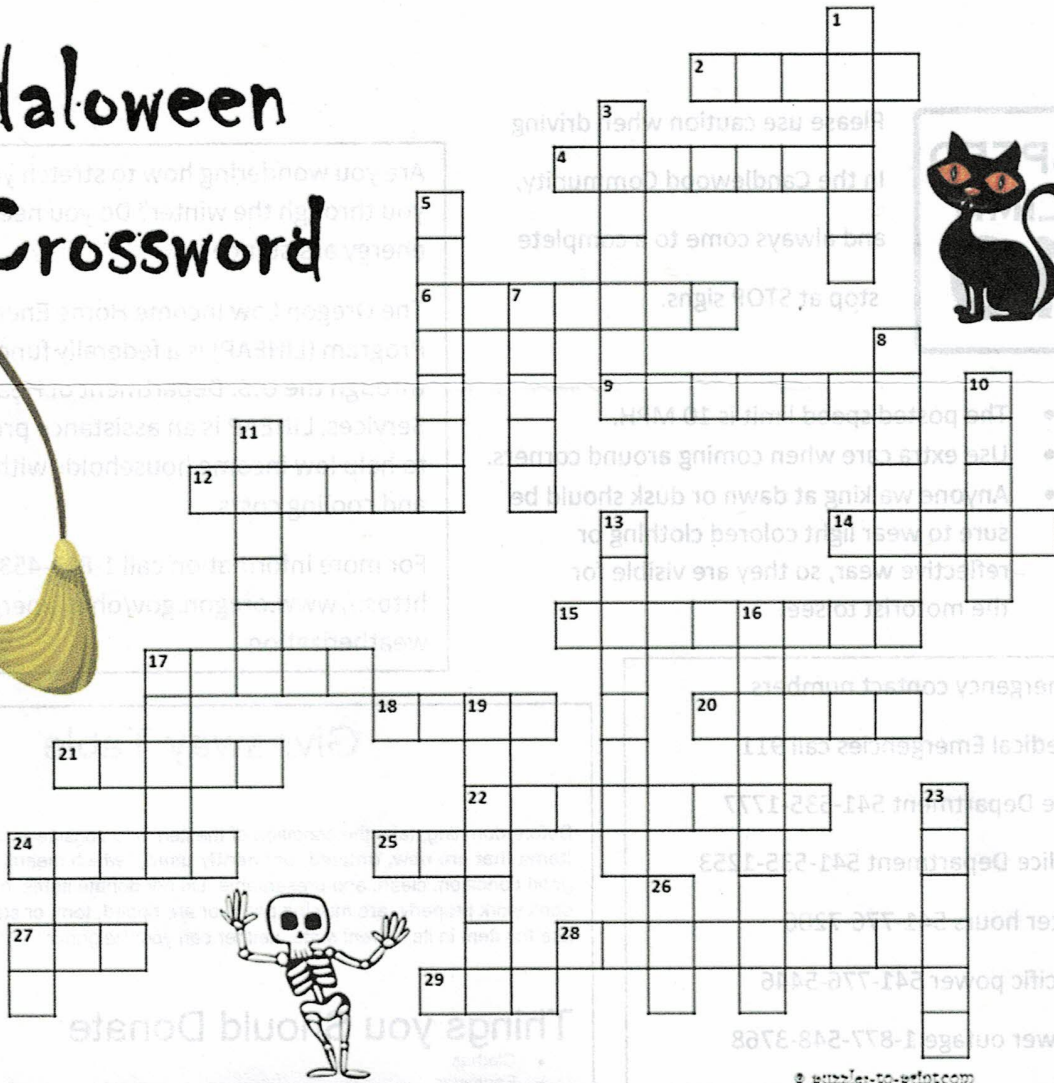
The recycle company will not pick up boxes that are not broken down and placed inside the recycle containers. So, please brake boxes down and not sit them on top of recycle containers.
